

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## Recipe of the Month



### Blackberry Peach Crumble

<p><b>2 cups</b> fresh blackberries</p> <p><b>2 cups</b> peeled and sliced fresh peaches or 1 (16 ounce) bag frozen peach slices, thawed</p> <p><b>1 teaspoon</b> grated lemon peel</p> <p><b>2 tablespoons</b> cornstarch</p> <p><b>1/3 cup,</b> plus <b>1/2 cup</b> packed brown sugar</p>	<p><b>1/2 cup</b> all-purpose flour</p> <p><b>1/2 cup</b> chopped blanched almonds, (optional)</p> <p><b>1/4 teaspoon</b> salt</p> <p><b>6 tablespoons</b> butter, cut into pieces</p>
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**Combine** blackberries, peaches, lemon peel, cornstarch and 1/3 cup brown sugar in a large bowl.

**Pour** ingredients into a lightly greased 8 inch baking dish.

**Mix** together flour, almonds, salt, and remaining 1/2 cup brown sugar. With pastry blender or two knives, cut in the butter until the mixture resembles coarse meal.

**Sprinkle** flour mixture over fruit.

**Bake** in a pre-heated 400° F oven for 30 minutes.

**Cool** 10 minutes prior to serving.

**Yield:** 8, 1/2 cup servings

**Nutritional Analysis:** 270 calories, 14 g fat, 25mg cholesterol, 135 mg sodium, 35 g carbohydrate, 2 g protein, 3 g fiber. Without almonds: 220 calories, 9 g fat, 25 mg cholesterol, 135 mg sodium, 35 g carbohydrate, 2 g protein, 3 g fiber.
